Starting Monday follows best friends Ellis, and Lynne. Lynne puts her life on hold to care for Ellis, who recently learned that she has cancer. Ellis struggles to live with her disease and accept the inevitable reality of her death, while Lynne struggles with the complexity and realities of the medical system, Ellis's mother, and what it means to Ellis to die with dignity. The show explores the limits of love, need and trust in friendship, the devastating impact terminal illness has on both the afflicted and the caretaker, and the importance of living in the now and not waiting until Monday.

Callback Scene & Monologue Starting Monday:

HELLEN. I don't know how you two live like this I can't find anything! Every cupboard door is open and every cup and plate is in the dishwasher! Are you packing it to move? Wonderful, Now she's stirring paint in the living room. Are you staring paint in the living room? I'll bet you're getting it on the floor. Tell me thats not yellow. Yellow is so tacky!

TRISH: Do you have power of attorney? (*lynne shakes her head no*) that's trouble If they put her on life support you can't get her off. She needs your protection and right now you can't protect her. You're not a relatively You have no say! in my job i follow orders i have no choice i just obey.

ELLIS. (Moans) Hello ... (Sits straight up; wearing her sheet.) Oh hi, Mom, Happy Ne ... No, I'm awake... What time is it? ... I know, I'm not on it. What ti ... Uh huh ... no... Could we (wispring so the person on the phone can't hear) Jim, wake up. Jim! I didn't expect company or I'd've stocked up. Anyway...ahh. What Mother...I don't have a hangover. (Beat.) I'm manifesting a hangover to punish myself. Oh God, I drink. I eat. I miss trains. (beat) Shit! Why do I have the feeling everything that happens today, is ment to punish me.

NURSE ETAN. YOU ARE HERE because you've had a catheter inserted into your subclavian area. because chemotherapy weakens your veins the subclavian catheter is your best friend. to administer one must insert the IV into the Harpoon cap. I will be happy to answer all questions at the end. it is imperative that you keep the line clean and kept from clogging. Before you leave Houston your significant other must demonstrate the ability to maintain this. It is imperative I repeat imperative to rid the Harpoon solution of air bubbles if you do not air will enter via the tube into the bloodstream you don't want air bubbles in your tube.

LYNNE. On a warm Monday morning driving south on the Jersey Turnpike, *I t*ook Ellis home. I arrived at the entrance at 6 AM, but the barrier gate was down: "No cars allowed 'til eight." I learned it was eleven miles to the inlet, eleven miles back. (*Beat.*) *I* noticed everything on that walk: the blackbirds, the spikemoss, Why the inlet: why not any beach? No, Ellis wanted the inlet. I turned off on a narrow pathway, until I gazed out at the morning ocean. The beach was deserted, the sea calm. I Took the box of ashes. Inside was a clear plastic bag with a wire tie. (*Beat.*) I waded into the ocean, the water cold against my legs, undid the tie. the ashes swirled in the foam. Then I heard a voice from the deepest part of me, a voice that sounded very much like Ellis and it said, "Now, live." (*Beat.*) "Don't wait for Monday."

ELLIS. Pass the mauve magenta.

LYNNE. There's no such thing as mauve magenta.

ELLIS. Pity. What else ya got?

LYNNE. Maize. Thistle. Bittersweet.

ELLIS. Thistle. (LYNNE Hands Ellis "thistle:" colors.) We can get a car when we dock there Cheap.

LYNNE. How cheap?

ELLIS. Doesn't have reverse; doesn't have a rear-view mirror. (*LYNNE gives a terrified look*) Oh, c'mon. What are you afraid of?

LYNNE. People, life, parallel parking... Must be nice to be able to turn off your brain. I think about everything I ever did, and why I did it. Then, I analyze everybody else. (*Beat.*) Have you noticed depression's easier to handle than euphoria?

ELLIS. (Crosses a page out.) Yuck.

LYNNE. That's the fifth page you've started.

ELLIS. I'm into perfect. Pass the "burnt sienna." (LYNNE does.) It's broken.

LYNNE. Still colors.

ELLIS. (Hands it back.) I don't want it. It's broken. (Takes another crayon; back to coloring.) My world; I make the rules.



Order of Jobs for 5 Minute Set Up:

: Techs with Victoria will start setting up immediately. **ON STAGE:** The Platforms must go on stage first! Well those are being pulled out props and the metal furnisher can be set. The ramps, stairs, and the bed can start to be pulled out at this time too. The stairs can be set at this time as long as they aren't in the of the platforms. However **THE PLATFORMS MUST BE PULLED OUT FIRST AND SET.** ONCE PLATFORMS ARE SET: The bed must be placed NEXT! The stairs, if not set already can be set along with the ramps. ONCE THE BED IS SET: Bedding and the presets can be set along with the end table. Throughout all of this the props can be set. 





Women preferred soft fabrics and neutral colors (nothing like the neon of the late 80s). Scarves were also all the way. Denim in general was very popular (as seen above) whether it's paints, jackets, overalls or skirts. In the 80s they loved their denim. Skirts were also popular and came in a variety of styles but the "prep style" of was especially popular typical of teens.



UTERINE CANCER

Estimated Lifetime Risk for 1:147* **Uterine Cancer**

- Cancer of the uterus is also referred to endometrial or uterine cancer.
- Endometrial cancer is a disease in which malignant (cancer) cells form in the tissues of the endometrium.
- The endometrium is the lining of the uterus, the hollow, muscular organ in a woman's pelvis.
- Cancer of the endometrium is different from cancer of the muscle of the uterus, which is called sarcoma of the uterus.

SYMPTOMS OF UTERINE CANCER

- Abnormal Vaginal Bleeding or discharge that is not normal for you.
- Pain in pelvis or abdomen especially when passing urine or having sex



RISK FACTORS OF UTERINE CANCER INCLUDE

- Obesity and lack of exercise
- Smoking
- Alcohol use - Family History

- Genetics
- Inability to fall pregnant
- Infrequent menstrual cycle or starting menses before the age of 12
- Oestrogen replacement therapy without the use of progesterone

About the Author

Anne Commire

Anne Commire was born August 11th 1939 and died in 2012. She was an American playwright and editor. She received the Eugene O'Neill Theater Award four times between 1973 and 1988. Her plays include Shay, Put Them All Together, The Melody Sisters and Starting Monday (the play this is about). She also had several books including Yesterday's Authors of Books for Children Breaking the Silence, (with Mariette Hartley) 'Historic World Leaders, Women in World History, Dictionary of Women Worldwide: and Moorville



Finding any reviews of the show was rather difficult. I found an old newspaper article from the New York Times, and random one from google books so....

New York Times Review April 5, 1990

In one review I found the author wrote "The grinding, day-to-day realities of terminal illness have rarely been dramatized on the stage with the exhaustive precision that Anne Commire drama "Starting Monday" brings to a subject that is almost inevitably depressing." In the same article the author remarked that the play "removes most of the sugar coating to concentrate on the physical and psychic experience of fighting illness and coming to terms with death." this creates a challenge for the actors portraying such roles. One of the strongest and most unique elements of the play is the "sense of documentary fidelity. Cancer is notoriously unpredictable, and the drama captures the terrible uncertainties and roller-coaster ups and downs of fighting the disease. Both actors "demonstrate an impressive stamina and a chemistry that is often compelling... the tough-minded portrayal of Ellis carries the character through an emotional and physical spectrum without a false step...played to the truth of a character who... is impulsive, feisty and insecure. Ms. Wiggins(Lynne) smoothly carries off the subtler... task of stepping in and out of the drama to narrate the story

The documentary quality of the play is also the source of many of its flaws. A scene of interminable delays in a hospital waiting room... intended to put the audience through the ordeal but ... is more likely to drive them out of the theater...An awkward montage of memories, during which the two actresses run back and forth on the stage fails to evoke the cementing of their affection during a vacation..."
